

FROM THE EDITOR



Welcome to Glevum Park this evening everyone and welcome to all our visitors, notably the players, management team, committee and supporters of Brimscombe & Thrupp FC.

I should probably insert a "magic of the cup" comment here, but (1) it is the Challenge Trophy; and (2) we don't experience a lot of magic in cup competitions, so I've forgotten what it means!

We played tonight's visitors in the Hellenic League on Saturday, when we came away with a 2-0 victory. TUFFLEY ROVERS CLUB HISTORY

The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and



Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19. Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).

Mustoe achieved an 18th place finish at the end of the 2022/23 season, his first full campaign, before achieving a healthy 14th place in 2023/24, with a much improved squad.

FROM THE MANAGER

Good evening and welcome to Glevum Park to all players, management, officials and supporters from Brimscombe & Thrupp FC.

After a good win and decent performance on Saturday we find ourselves up against the same opponents as we start our County Cup campaign. Although I will look to resting and freshening up where possible, we want to have a run on this competition one to keep our good momentum going. Secondly, it would be nice at some point to get some silverware to recognise our progress and all the hard work on and off the field.

To have eight wins in the league so far and a decent points tally gives us the confidence going into any game we play and we need to play without fear, without being complacent.

We do need to be more of a threat throughout the team. We need more players to contribute to the number of goals we score. If we can get the goals spread more across the team, the more chance we have of building confidence to try things. Our set pieces need to improve - we have plenty of opportunities during our games, but little reward in the 'goals for' column. We've been working on a few things in training recently, so hopefully this will change for the better.

After losing our last home encounter, we have followed that with two away wins, so we want to get back to winning ways at home tonight going into Saturday's tough encounter, when we will host Mangotsfield United.



Brimscombe FC

Brimscombe Football Club was established in 1886. In 1894 they were founder members of the Mid-Gloucestershire League, and played the first match in the league's history on 29 September against Stroud. In 1902 they switched to the new Stroud & District League and were its inaugural champions. They finished as runners-up in 1903–04, 1904–05 and 1905–06 before winning it again in 1906–07 and 1907–08. After twice finishing third, Brimscombe were runners-up again in 1910–11 and 1911–12. They won a fourth league title in 1912–13.

After World War I Brimscombe competed in the North Gloucestershire League, finishing as runners-up in 1919–20. They were founder members of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League in 1922, and its first champions. They won the league again in 1930–31, having finished second-bottom of the table the previous season. In 1946–47 they finished as runners-up, and were champions the following season. In 1968 the club switched to the Gloucestershire County League, finishing bottom of the table in their first season. After finishing bottom again in 1972–73, the club left the league.

Brimscombe & Thrupp

In the 1970s the club merged with Thrupp to form Brimscombe & Thrupp. They rejoined the Gloucestershire County League in 1985, but left after finishing bottom in 1988–89.[5] The club returned to the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League, and after finishing as Division One runners-up in 2008–09, they moved up to the Gloucestershire County League for a third time. [5] After winning the County League in 2010–11, the club were promoted to Division One West of the Hellenic League. They won the division in 2012–13, earning promotion to the Premier Division.[5] The following season saw them win both the Supplementary and Floodlit Cups.[6] In 2017–18 the club won the Gloucestershire Challenge Trophy, beating Bitton 3–1 in the final.[7]

The club has stayed in the Premier Division since being promoted and came close to moving up in the 2018/19 season, when they finished second after taking the league title challenge to the final day, only to be pushed into second place when Wantage Town beat Windsor to secure the title.



Luke Merchant Goalkeeper Club captain who returned to the club in the 2022/23 season, after a Hellenic League Premier Division title winning season at Bishops Cleeve. A great shot stopper, commanding presence and accomplished keeper. Holds the club record for Hellenic League appearances as a keeper.

Robin Hoffland

Goalkeeper

Now a long-serving player, despite his age, who acts as a capable back-up to Luke Merchant in goal, whenever needed. Has played for the club's 1sts, 2nds, 3rds, 4ths and 5ths, as well as the U18s and always gives his all. Reliable, in a word.

Macaulay Herbert

Defence

Begins this season as our longest-serving member of the squad. 'Macca' came through our U18s and is solid and dependable; an excellent defender who has been getting better with every season that passed. Has made over 290 first team appearances, despite several injuries punctuating each season. On course to reach 300 appearances this season.

Josh Stevens

Defence

Development Squad player of the season in 2023/24; broke into the first team squad during pre-season, putting in some excellent performances in central defence. Tall, strong in the air, solid in the tackle and capable in possession, this could be the season when he steps up into first team football.

Tawana Changa

Defence

Recent addition to the squad, after signing from Hartpury University, and an attacking full-back. Deceptively quick but very comfortable on the ball. Previously had trials for Southampton and played for the English Colleges Association.

Elijah Simpson

Defence

Player under Neil Mustoe at Gloucester City U18s and recently signed from Brimscombe & Thrupp and a great addition to the squad. Comfortable on the ball when in possession, shows a turn of pace, and good defensively. A key signing for this season.

Mark Pritchett

Defence

Tasted Hellenic League title winning success at Bishops Cleeve. Previously at Rovers as Player/Manager before stepping away from the role in 2021/22. Offers a no nonsense, uncompromising, good old-fashioned performance in every game, and a threat in the opposition box.

Ellis Clifford

Defence

Defence

Came through the U18s squad, after joining from Gloucester City's youth set-up. Made a breakthrough last season and amassed 14 appearances at left-back. Very promising youngster who will be looking to be a regular in 2024/25.

Ollie Hambling

Young defender who has progressed well with our U18s and recently made the step-up into the first team squad, albeit as an unused substitute. He is seen as a good prospect. Definitely one for the future

Sammie Hicks

Defence/Midfield

Now in his fourth season at the club, after spells at Gloucester City and Cinderford Town. Injuries have hampered his progress but he remains a reliable and very versatile member of the squad, capable of filling in at full-back, in midfield or in the No.10 role.

Harley Mustoe

Defence/Midfield

A member of this season's U18s squad after joining the squad late in 2023/24, Harley has gained experience playing County League football for Harwicke. Now holding down a regular first team spot. Most comfortable in midfield but has played at full-back and looked very accomplished.

Callum McGuirk

Defence/Midfield

Signed from Longlevens in 2022, where he'd largely been used at full-back, he is a hard-working midfielder, who looks comfortable on the ball. Played academy football during his earlier years, including a spell at Bristol City. Was originally with the Rovers, where he featured in our U18s squad.

Liam Smith

Midfield

Has Southern League experience. Calm in possession and possesses a good passing range, whilst also physically strong, will be looking to hold down a regular place in the side, after three injury hit campaigns. Offers experience and capable of dropping into the back four when needed.

Corey Warrington

Midfield

Signed during pre-season after excelling at Northern Senior League side Tredworth Tigers during 2023/24. A highly energetic midfielder who likes to get on the ball; he's ambitious and could be an excellent addition to the squad for 2024/25. although an injury in pre-season could limit his immediate progress.

Midfield

Another new signing and a great addition to the Rovers fold. Southern League experience with Slimbridge and then spent several seasons at Brimscombe & Thrupp. Combative, communicative, hard-working, great positionally and a leader. Just what we needed to add to our midfield!

Kieran Alder

Midfield/Forward

Returned to the club in 2022/23, after spells with Cinderford, Bishops Cleeve and Worcester City; and overcame injuries to return to his best. Gifted No.10, whose work rate is as noticeable as his work on the ball - a creative player. Previously with Neil Mustoe's U18s at Gloucester City reunited at Rovers.

Tyrel Roberts

Forward

Another player to come through from the U18s and then through the Development Squad, Ty is an old-fashioned centre-forward who never gives the opposing defence a break and has been a regular scorer in his time in the club's junior sides. Another player for whom this could prove to be their breakthrough season.

Karnell Chambers

Forward

Experienced at a higher level, this is a player who Neil Mustoe was delighted to sign in November 2023. Previously at Gloucester City, Hungerford Town, North Leigh, as well as a spell overseas, and is a goalscorer equally at home wide or in the middle. Finished 23/24 as top Iscorer for the first team; added the threat that Rovers have needed.

Yeshaya Lomotey

Forward

Powerful striker who joined in 2021/22 after spells at other local clubs, including Slimbridge and Cinderford Town. Offers quality on the ball and packs a powerful shot that is a potent weapon. Will be hoping to contribute more goals to secure a regular place in the side.

Connor Walters

Forward

Wide player who joined from Gala Wilton in 2023/24. Strong and full of trickery, he had a fantastic start to his first season and contributed goals, as well as being a threat to opposition defences. Works hard for the team.

Riley Bourne

Forward

Under 18s player who graduated from our U16s last season. Quick, skilful, with an eye for goal, age is no impediment for this confident lad.

Spent many years as a professional at Manchester United, Wigan Athletic, Cambridge United, Stevenage and Yeovil Town, before over 350 appearances for Gloucester City. Previous coaching experience with City before a spell away from the game until his appointment with The Rovers.

Liam O'Neill

Assistant Manager Appointed as Assistant Manager in 2023, after a spell as Manager at Frampton United. Still in the formative stage of his coaching journey but offers great support to Muzzy and is an important presence in the first team set-up.

Mike De-Bear

Physio

New for 2024/25 and a great signing off the pitch. Has experience working at EFL clubs and is already making a great impression.

Alex Butler

Coach

Joined in 2023/24 after previous experience in local football. Mr Reliable and a really positive influence in the dressing room on match-days.

Previously been at Longlevens. Knew Muzzy and Ken Blackburn from his time with Gloucester City and is a great character. A keen cyclist, who also has an interest in classic cars.

MATCH REPORT

TUFFLEY ROVERS 2-1 BRIMSCOMBE & THRUPP UHLSPORT HELLENIC LEAGUE, PREMIER DIVISION

Former Brimscombe & Thrupp player Jordan Fletcher returned from injury to score a late, late winner for Tuffley Rovers and secure the Hellenic Premier Division new-boys their first points of the league season.

In front of a crowd of 123 spectators, Rovers more than held their own in the early exchanges, against established Premier Division opponents who had already secured maximum points in their opening league fixtures.

Clear chances were few and far between, with both sides having a share of

possession, in a game which will be remembered more for its industry, than the quality of football on display.

On 27 minutes, Rovers had the first chance of note, as midfielder Stu Griffith saw his shot cleared off the line, when he might have done better, and 6 minutes later, Rovers almost fell behind but Aaron Taylor acrobatically pushed Joe Tustain's header over the bar, as the Brimscombe forward found space to meet Ollie Pitt's centre. The game of attrition continued until half-time and both sides deserved to be level, as the first half ended at 0-0.

During the early stages of the second period, the game continued to be end to end, although Brimscombe started to look the more threatening side and Tustain went close from Ben Deakin's cross, narrowly heading wide when well placed.



The visitors were exerting increasing control and Taylor had to save smartly from Deakin, on 62 minutes, whilst Tustain and Pitt narrowly missed chances in the moments that immediately followed. Rovers defender Tristan Haswell then cleared a Chris Greenhough header off the line, after 66 minutes, as Rovers desperately sought to keep the scores level.

Despite the pressure, Brimscombe & Thrupp had been unable to seize the initiative and they were made to pay, as Rovers took the lead on 71 minutes. Substitute Liam Wright, who had entered the fray at halftime, swung the ball in from a corner and after Ashley Davies and Macaulay Herbert had challenged for the ball, Griffith bundled the ball home from two yards, as he threw his body in between a crowd of players.

Brimscombe once again had the better of things, immediately following the goal and equalised on 82 minutes, as Greenhough met Pitt's corner and headed home from close range.

Taylor saved smartly from Aaron Nash on 87 minutes and it looked like honours would finish even. However, Fletcher, who had been on the pitch for thirty minutes, met another Wright corner, with seconds remaining, and smashed the ball beyond Steve Sparrow in the visitors' goal, to record a fantastic victory for Warren Evans' men.


