TUFFLEY ROVERS CLUB HISTORY



The late Donald E Hall founded Tuffley Rovers FC in 1929. The Club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City Of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League. Senior XI Championship honours include that of the North Gloucestershire League and Stroud and District League (4 times) and in 1987/1988 the Club were Champions of the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League and gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League.

After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued as in the 1992/1993 season Rovers were Champions of Division One and also Division One League Cup Winners and after promotion competed in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League from 1993/1994, regularly finishing in the top half of the table. The 1998/1999 season saw Tuffley win the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup defeating Carterton Town in the final. Whilst the Club enjoyed this success, the 2nd XI and 3rd XI also gained promotion and championship honours. The 1998/1999 season saw the 2nd XI win the Northern Senior League and reach the finals of both the County Cup and League Cup, unfortunately losing out on both occasions. Promotion, however, was not possible as reserve teams were not allowed at that point to enter the Gloucestershire County League and progress further up the pyramid system.

The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever-changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the Club forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire.

After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division 2 of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division 1. After a slow start the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the Division 1 Title as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few seasons, an evolving squad finished 11th, 3rd, 6th and 3rd in the County League, before the 2012/13 Season marked an improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. This was followed up with the Runners'-up spot in 2014/15 and promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division, exactly ten years after they had withdrawn from the League.

The first season saw a struggle against relegation, ultimately resulting in the resignation of Warren Evans as manager, before the club retained their status due to a vacancy in the league, after finishing 17th. Mark Pritchett was then appointed as Player/Manager and took the side to consecutive 10th placed finishes, before a 15th place finish in 2018/19. Two pandemic affected seasons then passed, with Pritchett leaving the club part-way through. Rich Cox took over as Manager for a single season, but resigned midway through 2021/22 after a disastrous run of results. Former Manchester United player Neil Mustoe then took over, steering the club away from danger (finishing in 17th place).

Mustoe achieved an 18th place finish at the end of the 2022/23 season, his first full campaign, before achieving a healthy 14th place in 2023/24, with a much improved squad.

The season disappointingly finishes tonight, on a Tuesday rather than a Saturday, meaning we will not be able to have an end of season opportunity to socialise as we would ordinarily like to, but I thank you all for your support.

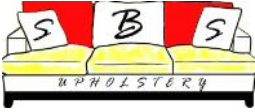

PREVIOUSLY AGAINST TODAY'S OPPONENTS

We look back at our seven previous competitive games against today's opposition, with some details around the key moments....

14 August 2021, UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division

A disastrous start to their first visit to Corsham Town, as Josh Swales' rash penalty saw the hosts awarded a penalty after just 30 seconds, was the precursor to a disappointing afternoon for Rich Cox's side, who returned home with a 2-0 defeat behind them. Matt Morris netted the penalty and Gary Higdon secured the points with a 75th minute goal.

18 December 2021, UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division

Tuffley Rovers succumbed to a ninth consecutive UHlsport Hellenic League defeat, and 11th defeat in 12 competitive fixtures, as Corsham left Glevum Park with a 3-0 victory, in what proved to be manager Rich Cox's final game at the helm. A second minute goal from Baldwin Igbinobaro gave Rovers the worst possible start, before a Matt Morris penalty made it 2-0 moments before the interval. Then, in the final minute of the game, Rovers' keeper Jack Copland could only turn Chris Allen's free-kick into his own net to make it 3-0.

4 February 2023, UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division

Tuffley Rovers continued their poor run against visitors Corsham Town, as the title challenging side left Glevum Park with a 2-0 win, courtesy of goals from Ollie Pitt and Niekell Plummer.

18 April 2023, UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division

A spirited display from Tuffley Rovers wasn't enough as they slipped to a 1-0 defeat away at Corsham Town, who were fighting for promotion but had to rely on a late goal from substitute James Vincent to secure the win. Shayne Bradley was sent-off for Rovers to make it a disappointing evening in Wiltshire.

28 October 2023, UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division

Two goals within the space of five minutes condemned Tuffley Rovers to a fifth consecutive league defeat against Corsham Town, as goals from Owen Humphries and Daniel Price secured a 2-0 win for the hosts.

1 January 2024, UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division

Kane Simpson's 16 minute goal proved enough to earn promotion chasing Corsham Town a 1-0 win at Tuffley Rovers, although the visitors owed much to an inspired goalkeeping performance from Sam Jepson, who was the star of their show.

26 October 2024, UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division

Tuffley Rovers secured a first ever Hellenic League Premier Division win against Corsham Town, as Karnell Chambers close range finished took them to a 1-0 win, although the margin might have been greater had Chambers also converted a second-half penalty.





ON (OR AROUND) THIS DAY IN HISTORY...

Current records date back, fairly accurately, to the 2007/08 season and although there are a few gaps stopping us having a full set of data, it gives us the opportunity to include a new programme feature that allows us to reflect on days gone by and fixtures on, or around, today's date.

Since those records began, we've had three games on 1 April that we can look back at and reflect on our fortunes...

1 April 2013

A solitary goal from defender Leone Cornwall proved enough to secure a vital three points in Tuffley Rovers quest for promotion from the Gloucestershire County League.

Hosts Taverners pushed Doug Foxwell's side all the way, but the Rovers defence stood firm and Cornwall's effort proved the difference between the two teams, allowing Rovers to maintain their place at the top of the league table.

1 April 2017

Tuffley Rovers survived another mixed performance - brilliant in the first half, something they couldn't sustain in the second - to record a first league victory since 7 January, as Player/Manager Mark Pritchett's headed goal proved decisive against Ascot United.

If there were fears that Rovers would, once again, fail to capitalise on a good first half, those fears subsided a little, on 34 minutes, as Pritchett leapt highest to meet Jamie Goodwin's magnificent cross and head home from close range.

As the game wore on, Rovers became camped in their own half, despite their earlier superiority, seemingly gripped by the fear of a fifth consecutive defeat, but they defended stoutly and Ascot failed to test Evans, in the Rovers goal.

1 April 2023

A depleted Tuffley Rovers squad pushed title chasing Malvern Town all the way but were ultimately on the wrong end of a 3-1 scoreline.

Harry Clark and Ben Hayes netted for the hosts in the first period but Ryan Dobbins' goal saw Rovers still in the game at half-time. Hayes' second goal, on the hour, ultimately sealed the points for Malvern, but manager Neil Mustoe had plenty to be proud of as his side worked incredibly hard to stay in the game and had chances that might have got them a point on another day.

Although we still have tonight's game to include in our statistics for the 2024/25 season, we're close enough to the end of the season to reflect upon the numbers for this campaign in the UHlsport Hellenic League, League cups, GFA Challenge Trophy, FA Cup and FA Vase. We've played 44 times prior to today and here some numbers for you to review:

1. A total of 33 players have been named in our match-day squad, with 30 players appearing in the team (starting or used as a substitute).
2. 15 players made their first team debut for the club, of which 6 played fewer than 5 times.
3. 6 players have made 40 appearances or more this season.
4. 12 different players scored in a competitive fixture, with Karnell Chambers leading the way on 25 goals. He is the first player to score 20 goals in a season since Shayne Bradley scored 23 during our Gloucestershire County League season in 2011/12 and the highest ever goal tally since these records began.
5. We have kept 11 clean sheets prior to today. Our second best at Step 5 since returning in 2015/16. Our best season was 2022/23 when we kept 12 clean sheets (albeit in 51 games). One more today, please!

NB: The figures are correct for all league competitions from season 2007/08, when Tuffley Rovers returned to the County League (Step 7) and include all competitive games since the start of the 2013/14 season. There are some gaps in the information relating to cup games prior to the start of the 2013/14 campaign. This period is currently subject to a thorough review and there may be some variation to statistics in due course.

CORSHAM TOWN CLUB HISTORY



The earliest record found of Corsham Football Club is 1878 with the club becoming affiliated to the Football Association in 1893. Over the years, the team has often been referred to as the Quarrymen due to high levels of quarrying in and around Corsham.

In March 1894, the first Wiltshire Football League was formed with the original member clubs being Bradford, Calne, Chippenham, Corsham, Southbroom (Devizes), Melksham, Trowbridge Town, and Warminster. At the end of the 1894/95 season Corsham would be the inaugural champions, winning the league on goal average over Southbroom, helped by an emphatic 17 - 1 win over Calne in their final game. Promotion was achieved to the Western League at the end of the 1997/98 season after winning the county league by goal difference from Devizes Town Reserves.

2006/07 season saw Corsham Town winning the Western League Premier Division, which was hotly contested by many teams, including Bridgwater Town and Frome Town. The club also added a third successive Wiltshire Senior Cup victory, again over local rivals Melksham Town.

Due to the Covid pandemic the 2019/20 season was declared null and void by the Football Association on 26th March 2020. The 2020/21 season saw Keiran Baggs becoming the new manager with Gary Higdon as his assistant. Unfortunately, after 10 league games the 2020/21 was curtailed by the FA due to the Covid pandemic. Despite the last two seasons being affected by Covid, the FA went ahead with planned restructuring of the Non-League Pyramid. The results from 2019/20 & 2021/21 were combined and this meant that Corsham Town were promoted.

The 2021/22 season finished with the team in a very creditable 5th position in the Hellenic League Premier Division and reached the final of the Wiltshire Premier Shield Cup played at the County Ground against Swindon Supermarine. In 2022/23 the club reached the semi-final of the FA Vase, with visitors Ascot Utd winning 4 - 5 on penalties after the full-time score was 2 - 2 in front of a club record breaking 1,736 spectators. A very respectful 3rd place finish in the league was also achieved. That was bettered in 2023/24 as Baggs' team finished in 2nd place finish, but that was followed by the disappointment in the play-off losing to Cinderford Town who gained promotion to Step 4. Silverware was brought home with a win in the Hellenic League Challenge Cup against Worcester City, with the score finishing 2-2 at 90 minutes, before Corsham won 3-2 on penalties.

Manager Kieran Baggs and all his staff stepped down from their roles at the club in July 2024 and a short time later the club announced their new management team of Marvin Brown and Ashley Morgan, both UEFA Licenced qualified coaches.
